- ▶ UTM will induct former NFL players, Tony Champion & Fred Thompson, in its athletics Hall of Fame.
- ▶ UTM has seven players on its roster from East Tennessee (including Stephen Shiver and Kenny Jones).

## HEAD COACH JASON SIMPSON (5TH SEASON, 26-20)

It didn't take Jason Simpson long to move the UT Martin football team into the upper echelon of the Ohio Valley Conference. After four seasons, Simpson sports a .565 overall (26-20) winning percentage, the highest in the 10-team conference and 62-year-old league.

Simpson is 20-11 in the OVC and has one OVC championship to his credit and came within a field goal of a second championship in 2008. He led the Skyhawks to the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) postseason for the first time in school history (2006) and his teams have been ranked among the top 25 in the nation annually. The Skyhawks received votes in the FCS polls seven out of 14 weeks during the 2009 season.

Simpson and the Skyhawks marched to a 5-6 overall record and sported a 4-4 OVC worksheet in 2009. The team opened its campaign with a 56-0 lambasting over Iowa Wesleyan and won three of its last four games of the season in convincing fashion. Among those victories

was a 38-24 triumph over rival Murray State and a 48-38 shootout with Austin Peay. The Skyhawks were ranked 27th in the nation in rushing offense, 22nd in the nation in passing offense, 37th in scoring offense, 31st in rushing defense, 19th in punt return yardage/defense, 30th for tackles for a loss per game, 25th for third down conversion percentage and 17th for time of possession.

Cade Thompson, Simpson's starting quarterback for the past two seasons, was 20th in the nation in passing yards per game and total passing yards (2,546). Thompson set new school records for passing yards, completion percentage and touchdown passes in 2009.

Offensive tackle Joe Gibbs, junior linebacker Josh Bey, tailback Brandyn Young and freshman tailback Jason McNair reeled in All-OVC honors in 2009 for Simpson and the Skyhawks. Gibbs was also named to three All-America teams and claimed UT Martin's Bob Carroll Male Athlete of the Year Award. Gibbs recently earned a tryout with the NFL's New York Jets.

Simpson led the 2008 Skyhawks to an 8-4 overall campaign and a 6-2 OVC record. The team received votes in both the FCS Coaches Poll and the Sports Network Poll, and was ranked 25th in the nation in the final Sports Media Entertainment (SME) Network poll.

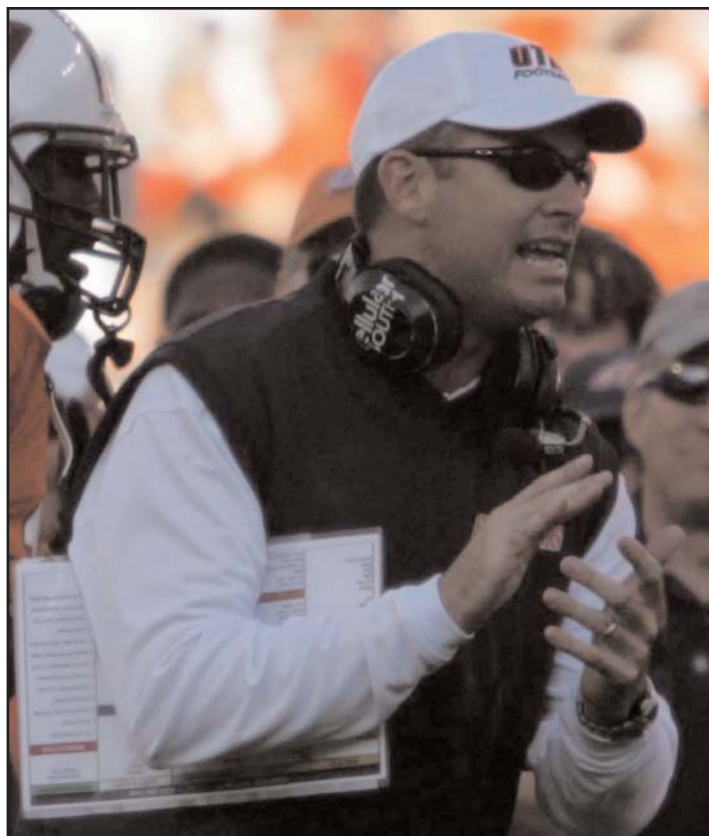
The team was ranked fourth in the nation in scoring offense (37.33) and sixth in fumbles recovered (16). The Skyhawks were also ranked among the nation's top 40 teams in rushing offense (34), passing offense (35), total offense (16), punt returns (23), kickoff returns (38), passing efficiency (27), sacks (19), tackles for loss (7), third down conversion percentage (8) and fourth down conversion percentage (8).

The head coach had five first team All-OVC selections including quarterback Cade Thompson, wide receiver Mike Hicks, offensive lineman Kevin Bannon, defensive lineman Ray Williams and defensive back Dontrell Miller.

Miller earned All-American honors from the Associated Press, the AFCA and the Sports Network. He was also included in CSN's Fabulous 50 team. Williams picked up honorable mention All-American honors from The Sports Network.

In 2007, the Skyhawks closed out the season by winning four of their last five games. The Skyhawk offense exploded in the second half of the season with a 76-34 victory over Murray State and a 55-20 thumping over Southeast Missouri State.

While the second half of the season was loaded with excitement, the first half was a challenge to say the least. The Skyhawks lost their first three OVC games by a combined nine points. The team finished the season with a 4-7 overall record and a 4-4 mark in the OVC. Linebacker Josh Yarbrough led the team in tackles and earned All-OVC honors and honorable mention All-American honors from the Sports Network. Running back Don Chapman closed out his career as UT Martin's all-time rushing leader with 5,017 yards. Chapman became only the 14th Division I player to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. Return specialist Jessie "Juice" Burton was the Sports Network's third best kick returner. Burton was invited to the Canadian Football League's Calgary Stampeders training camp.



In 2006, Simpson's first year, the Skyhawks posted a 9-3 overall record and a 6-1 mark in the OVC standings. The overall worksheet was the best for the Skyhawks since 1988 when they advance to postseason play as a Division II team. The six OVC victories were the most for the Skyhawks since joining the league in 1992. Of the nine victories, five were road wins and it marked the first time the Skyhawks won an OVC road game since 1996.

Along with wins, Simpson led the Skyhawks to national rankings for the first time since 1989 and top 10 statistical rankings in pass efficiency defense (2), total defense (6), pass defense (7). The team was 12th in rushing offense while Chapman was ranked No. 9 in rushing offense (128.36 yards per game). Burton was ranked seventh in kickoff returns (26.2 yards per return).

Simpson finished fourth in the annual voting for the Eddie Robinson Award, the nation's best coach. He was named the American Football Coaches Association Region 3 Coach of the Year and he earned the OVC's Roy Kidd Coach of the Year trophy.

Before accepting his first head coaching job at UT Martin, Simpson was the offensive coordinator at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. He was instrumental in the resurgence of the UTC football program. In 2005, Chattanooga posted a 6-5 campaign, the school's first winning season since 1997.

At Chattanooga, Simpson coached quarterback Cedric Stevens who threw for more than 3,100 yards with a 66 percent completion percentage. With 20 touchdown passes, Stevens was named national Division I-AA Player of the Week. Stevens turned in a stellar effort with 540 yards of passing and five touchdowns as he helped Chattanooga pile up 697 yards of total offense in a 59-56 win over Appalachian State.

In 2004, Simpson's offense finished 14th in Division I-AA for passing and 32nd in scoring with 29.2 points per game. Simpson also coached Alonzo Nix at Chattanooga. Nix broke the Southern Conference record for receptions in a season with 90 catches. He earned all-conference honors in 2003 and 2004. In 2003 he was an All-American and in 2004 he was a preseason Walter Payton Award finalist.

Before Chattanooga, Simpson coached at Texas State University, a member

of the Southland Football League. He coached quarterbacks, receivers and served as the team's recruiting coordinator. At Texas State, Simpson coached Tyson Ollvo who is the school's third all-time receptions leader. In 2000, Texas State posted a 7-4 record, the school's first winning season in 10 years.

Simpson served as an assistant coach from 1997-1999 at Jacksonville State University. He coached quarterbacks and was the team's passing game coordinator. He also coached receivers and served as an assistant special teams coordinator. He was a member of the Jacksonville State staff responsible for the third best turnaround in Division I football for the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

At Jacksonville State, Simpson coached Reggie Stencil, the Southland Football Conference Freshman of the Year; two-time All-Southland wide receiver Joey Hamilton who signed with the NFL's Oakland Raiders. Hamilton is Jacksonville State's all-time leading receiver with more than 2,903 yards and he holds five career records. Simpson also coached all-conference wide receiver Ronald Bonner who signed with the Canadian Football League's Hamilton Tiger Cats and Montressa Kirby, the 1998 Southland Offensive Player of the Year. Kirby is Jacksonville State's all-time offensive leader with more than 7,688 yards.

Simpson is a native of Ellisville, Miss. He signed as a quarterback with Mississippi State and played for two seasons for the Bulldogs. He also played baseball for Ron Polk at State before transferring to Southern Miss in 1992. At Southern Miss, Simpson was a two-time all-conference selection in baseball and was team captain his senior season. After earning a bachelor's degree in 1994 from Southern Miss, he spent the next year as a graduate assistant football coach at Delta State, where he coached defensive backs. In the spring of 1995, Simpson served as an assistant football and head baseball coach at Collins High School in Mississippi.

Simpson and his wife, the former Julie Wilkerson, have two sons and a daughter: Ty, 6 years old, Emma, 5 years old and Graham, 1 year old. The family lives in Martin and attends First Baptist Church.

## NOTING THE SKYHAWKS

### SIMPSON WELCOMES FOUR NEW MEMBERS TO COACHING STAFF

Fifth-year head coach Jason Simpson welcomes four new members to his coaching staff. The newcomers include Jordon Hankins, a UT Martin alumnus who will coach running backs and serve as the strength and conditioning coach; Nathan Burton, a former Georgia Tech safety who worked under the guidance of defensive masterminds Bill Young at Oklahoma State and Jon Tenuta at Georgia Tech, will coach linebackers; Ryan Nielsen, who served as the defensive line coach at Ole Miss under Ed Orgeron and played at the University of Southern Cal, will coach the defensive line and serve as the special teams coordinator; and Mac Bryan, who has 19 years of collegiate coaching experience at Chattanooga, Pikeville, Newberry, Lees McRae, and Southern Miss, will coach the offensive line and serve as the Skyhawks offensive coordinator.

### ELDER STATESMAN

First year head coach Mac Bryan, 50, is the oldest member of the Skyhawk coaching staff. Bryan comes to UT Martin from Enka High School in North Carolina where he served as head coach and led the Jets to their best season since 2002. Bryan also coached at Chattanooga and at Southern Miss in his 19 years as a collegiate coach. While at Chattanooga, Bryan coached former UT Martin assistant Geep Wade. While at Southern Miss, Bryan coached UT Martin head coach Jason Simpson. Bryan served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Appalachian State. He played offensive tackle for head coaches Jim Brakefield and Mike Working from 1978-80.

### FORMER OL GIBBS SIGNS WITH NFL'S RAMS

Offensive lineman Joe Gibbs, a three-time All-American and two-time All-Ohio Valley Conference honoree, signed a free agent contract with the National Football League's St. Louis Rams in June. Gibbs started 11 games at right tackle for the Skyhawks in 2009 and did not allow a sack all season. He played a key role in UT Martin's offensive success in 2009, as the Skyhawks were third in the Ohio Valley Conference in rushing offense, second in total offense, second in scoring and first in passing offense. In addition to being an All-OVC first team selection, he was also named an Associated Press FCS All-American and was also the only OVC player to be named to the American Football Coaches Association FCS All-American squad. Before the season, he was named a second-team preseason All-American by the Consensus Draft Services following a second-team all-conference selection in 2008. Gibbs started in 37 out of 40 games in his career, including 31 consecutive games on the offensive line to close out his career. The last two seasons, he graded out at 87 percent and didn't allow a single sack in 23 starts. Gibbs' signing marks the first time a UT Martin player has struck a free agent deal with an NFL team since Sam Dudley (Seattle Seahawks) and Andre Langley (Arizona Cardinals) inked deals in 1988.

### BEY NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN TEAM

Linebacker Josh Bey (6-0, 220 pounds), was named to the second team 2010 Consensus Draft Services (CDS) Preseason Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) All-American team in June. Bey, a native of Springfield, earned CSN Fabulous 50 Honorable Mention honors and first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference accolades in 2009. He led the Skyhawks in total tackles with 107 and was second in the OVC in total tackles. He was ranked among the top 40 in the NCAA FCS in three statistical categories: tackles/game (30th); sacks/game (40th); and tackles for loss/game (10th).

### REUNITED AGAIN

Former UT Martin assistant coaches Marcus Satterfield, Geep Wade and Jimmy Lindsey are all on head coach Russ Huesman's staff at Chattanooga. Satterfield left following the 2008 season, while Wade and Lindsey left after the 2009 season.

### FORMER UT MARTIN ASSISTANTS MOVE UP

Five former UT Martin assistant head coaches were named head coaches after the 2009 season. Among the five were Charlie Stubbs, Cesar Rivas-Sandoval, Todd Berry, Larry Porter and Mike MacIntyre. Stubbs was named the head coach at Nicholls State; Rivas-Sandoval was named the interim successor to Ed Rifilato at Fort Lewis College; Berry, who completed three seasons as the associate head coach and offensive coordinator at UNLV was named the 14th head football coach at Louisiana-Monroe (ULM); Porter, who played at Memphis from 1990-93 and served as a UT Martin assistant on the same staff with former head coach Matt Griffin, was named the 22nd head football coach at the University of Memphis; and MacIntyre, the 2009 American Football Coaches Association Football Bowl Subdivision Assistant Coach of the Year and former Duke University defensive coordinator was named the head coach at San Jose State University.

### SEASON OPENER AGAINST BIG BROTHER

The UT Martin Skyhawks will open the 2010 season on the road against the University of Tennessee at Knoxville. The two teams are scheduled to meet Sept. 4 in Neyland Stadium. It will be the first meeting between the two teams from the UT system. The showdown against the Southeastern Conference power marks the second time in the past three years the Skyhawks, a member of the Football Championship Subdivision, have played an SEC Bowl Championship Subdivision team. The Skyhawks played at Auburn in 2008.

### TWICE ON THURSDAY

This year's football schedule includes two Thursday night games against in-state rivals Tennessee Tech and Lambuth University. The Skyhawks travel to Cookeville for an Ohio Valley Conference game against host Tennessee Tech on Thursday, Sept. 30. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. The Skyhawks will host Lambuth at Hardy M. Graham Stadium on Thursday, Oct. 21.

### FORMER SKYHAWKS RETURN TO ACTION

Dexter Anoka, the former Skyhawk wide receiver and quarterback, landed a job in West Tennessee this past summer with the West Tennessee War Eagles, a member of the Gridiron Developmental Football League. Anoka was the War Eagles starting quarterback and has led the team to a 4-0 start. Don Chapman, who graduated in 2007 and holds UT Martin's all-time rushing record, played for the Yakima Valley Warriors in the American Indoor Football Association. The Warriors finished the regular season with a 7-7 won-loss record.

### ON TELEVISION

The Skyhawks will play on live television twice this season. The Sept. 25 game at Murray State and the Nov. 13 game at Hardy M. Graham Stadium against Tennessee State will be broadcasted live. Kickoff for both games is set for 6 p.m. Four of the five UT Martin home games will be replayed on WLJT-HDTV Channel 11 in West Tennessee. Home games against Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State, Eastern Kentucky and Lambuth will be replayed at 9 p.m. on Saturdays and at 3:30 p.m. Sundays.

### LATE BCS TRANSFERS

Kelton Hall and T.J. Drakeford have transferred to UT Martin this summer. Hall, a tight end, transferred from Nevada, while Drakeford transferred from Marshall. Hall is a 6-4, 245-pound tight end who prepped at Damonte Ranch High School in Reno where he played football, basketball and ran track and field. Drakeford, a defensive back, is a 5-11, 190-pounder who prepped at Independence High School in Charlotte, N.C. Drakeford saw action in five games at Marshall and started four. He had 12 total tackles.

### RIVARLY RENEWED

UT Martin has renewed its rivalry with Southeastern Louisiana in 2010 and 2011. The Skyhawks will travel to Hammond, La., to face the Lions on Sept. 11, 2010 at Strawberry Stadium, while the Lions make the trip to Hardy M. Graham Stadium on Sept. 3, 2011. UT Martin and Southeastern were rivals in the Gulf South Conference from 1974-76. The last time the two teams played was in 1981 when Southeastern claimed a 13-10 victory. Southeastern leads the series 3-1 and claimed a pair of wins in Hammond in 1974 and 1976. UT Martin won the only game played in Martin - in 1975 - 23-7 under the direction of head coach George MacIntyre.

### BEY NAMED OVC PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

UT Martin senior linebacker Josh Bey has been tabbed the 2010 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors.

Defensively Bey ranked 10th nationally in tackles-for-loss last season (16.5), while also ranking in the top 40th nationally in tackles (1.50/game) and sacks (0.59/game).

### TWO FORMER NFL PLAYERS SET FOR HALL OF FAME INDUCTION

Former NFL and UT Martin players Tony Champion (1981-84) and Fred Thomas (1995) will be among eight people inducted in The University of Tennessee at Martin athletics Hall of Fame Saturday, Oct. 16 during the 27th annual Letterwinners Club and Hall of Fame Breakfast in the Student Life Center on campus. Champion was one of the most prolific and productive players in UT Martin football history. He played for head coaches Lynn Amadee and Fred Pickard and was a four-year letterman. He caught 72 passes for 1,531 yards and 14 touchdowns in 25 career games. After UT Martin, he signed a free agent contract with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys. He played for the San Diego Chargers and Green Bay Packers. However, Champion is well known for his career in the Canadian Football League where he played for the Hamilton Tiger-Cats from 1985-88 and 1990-92. The two-time Eastern Division all-star caught 74 passes for 1,216 yards in 1986 and helped the Tiger-Cats win the Grey Cup. Thomas played one season for the Skyhawks (1995). He earned All-Ohio Valley Conference first-team honors and recorded 69 tackles and four interceptions. He was the 47th pick in the 1996 NFL draft, the highest pick ever in UT Martin history. He was picked by the Seattle Seahawks in the second round. Thomas signed with the New Orleans Saints in the winter of 2000. He received the New Orleans Saints Ed Block Courage Award in 2002. He played in 156 NFL games and started in 80 over 12 seasons. He recorded 424 career solo tackles and 360 total tackles, 13 interceptions and 73 pass deflections. Thomas announced his retirement from the NFL in 2009.

### SKYHAWKS EARN PRESEASON RECOGNITION IN PREVIEW MAGAZINE

Linebacker Josh Bey was named to Phil Steele's College Football Preview All-Ohio Valley Conference first team. Three other UT Martin players, Kenny Jones, Rodney Irvin and Jeremy Buchanan were named to Steele's All-OVC second team.

Bey (6-0, 220 pounds) led the Skyhawks in total tackles with 107 and was second in the OVC in total tackles. He was ranked among the top 40 in the NCAA FCS in three statistical categories: tackles/game (30th); sacks/game (40th); and tackles for loss/game (10th).

Recently Bey was named to the second team 2010 Consensus Draft Services (CDS) Preseason Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) All-American team. Bey, a native of Springfield, earned CSN Fabulous 50 Honorable Mention honors and first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference accolades in 2009.

Jones (Jr., 6-0, 235) will make the transition from tight end to fullback this season, after scoring three receiving touchdowns in 2009. Buchanan (Sr., 6-4, 300) moves from tight end to right tackle on the offensive line, while Irvin (R-Jr., 6-3, 290) will anchor the Skyhawks' offensive line from his left tackle position.
