ONE TO WATCH

He's back. The Pac-10's leading returning rusher, **LaMichael James**, will make his 2010 debut on Saturday in Knoxville. James, who sat out the season opener due to a one-game suspension, rushed for a freshman conference record 1,546 yards last season. The speedy back will have his work cut out for him to catch teammate Kenjon Barner, who had 147 yards and 4 TDs in his absence.



GAME TIME

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. EDT/4 p.m. PDT at Neyland Stadium with a **live telecast on ESPN2**. A live radio broadcast will be available across the Oregon Sports Network and on XM 201 and Sirius 218.

THE SERIES

- The Ducks and Volunteers will be meeting for the first time this Saturday.
- UO is 3-4 all-time against schools from the Southeastern Conference, but has won the past two meetings vs. the SEC, defeating Mississippi State both times: 36-13 at home in 2002 and 42-34 in Starkville in '03.

QUICK HITS

- Oregon's 72 points last week were the most in any college football game involving 1 or 2 FBS schools.
- UO leads the nation in total offense (720.0 avg.), scoring offense (72.0), scoring defense (0.0), punt returns (44.7), turnover margin (+4.0) and fewest sacks allowed (0.0).
- Individually, SO CB **Cliff Harris** is the national leader in punt returns (62.5) and SO RB **Kenjon Barner** tops the NCAA in scoring (30.0).
- Eugene native and Oregon football alum **Justin Wilcox** (1996-99) is in his first year as UT's defensive coordinator. His former teammate with the Ducks, **Peter Sirmon** (1996-99), is a graduate assistant coach for the Vols after serving in the same capacity at Oregon last season.
- After one game, 14 Ducks have at least one reception, compared to 12 all of last season.
- Of Oregon's 12 scores on the season (9 TD/3 FG), 11 have been recorded by freshmen or sophomores.

MEDIA AVAILABILITY

Following the first week of the season, **Chip Kelly** will be available to all media via a weekly teleconference every Tuesday beginning at 11:30 a.m. (PT). Participants may take part in the media availability in person at the Casanova Center or on the phone. To gather more information on the availability or notify the Office of Media Services of your intent to take part, please call (541) 346-5488.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interview requests for players and coaches require 24 hours notice and must go through the media services office. Interviews will take place during a 15-minute window at the conclusion of each practice. No player interviews will be granted on the day before a game.

HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY

What more could be asked from Oregon's 30th head coach, who became the first in Pac-10 history to win an outright conference title in his first season at the helm. Becoming the school's first mentor to take it to the Rose Bowl, as well as earning coach-of-the-year accolades in 15 years, the Manchester, N.H., native guided his team to more wins in his first year in the Pac-8/10 since John Robinson led USC to 10 wins in 1976.

RECORD ROUT

Oregon's 72-0 rout of New Mexico on Sept. 4 produced a fair number of school records, including 720 yards of total offense to best the old mark of 694 at Oregon State in the 2008 Civil War. The Ducks equaled the program's modern scoring record with 72 points while setting a new modern record for scoring margin (also 72 points), the most since a 72-10 victory vs. Nevada, Sept. 18, 1999. It was UO's most points overall since a 97-0 win over Willamette (Ore.) in 1916.

LEADERS OF THE PAC

All ten conference teams were in action in Week 1 with six recording wins. Not surprisingly, on the heels of their 72-point victory, Oregon leads the Pac-10 in 11 different statistical categories: Scoring offense (72.0), scoring defense (0.0), total offense (720.0), rushing offense (369.0), pass efficiency defense (54.6), punt return average (44.7), PAT kicking (9-9, 1.000), sacks against (0.0), first downs (35.0), opponent 4th-down conversions (0-4, .000) and turnover margin (+4). Individually, SO RB **Kenjon Barner** is the league's top man in scoring (30.0) and all-purpose yards (225.0), and SO CB **Cliff Harris** is the top punt

returner (62.5). FR K **Eric Solis** is leads all kickers in scoring (18.0).

BARNER BURNER

SO RB **Kenjon Barner** equaled UO's modern scoring record with 5 touchdowns (4 rush, 1 rec) vs. New Mexico Sept. 4, tying **Saladin McCullough**, who ran for five scores vs. Arizona, Nov. 9, 1996. Barner scored all 30 of his points before halftime, surpassing his 2009 season total of 24 (3 rush TD, 1 ret TD).

ALL-PURPOSE BACK

SO RB **Kenjon Barner** has led the team in all-purpose yards in each of the last three games, dating to 2009. The one-time defensive back has totaled 645 yards in that span, including 225 vs. New Mexico Sept. 4.

CLIFF NOTES

Of the many records set in Oregon's lopsided 72-0 victory over New Mexico to start the season, none may hold up longer than the mark set by SO CB **Cliff Harris**, who became the first UO player to return two punts for touchdowns in a single game. The Fresno, Calif., product replaced regular returner SO RB **Kenjon Barner**, who was given the rest of the day off with UO on top 42-0 in the second quarter, and fielded the first two punts of his career, taking one back for 61 yards and the next for 64. Harris tied Oregon's season record for punt return TDs and also tied the conference single-game record, which was last accomplished by USC's Mike Garrett in 1965 vs. Cal (also Sam Brown, UCLA vs. Stanford, 1954).

PAC-10, NAT'L PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

SO RB **Kenjon Barner** (offense) and SO CB **Cliff Harris** (special teams) were named Pac-10 players of the week for Week 1. Barner earned the award for his Oregon record-tying 5 touchdown performance in the Ducks' 72-0 win over New Mexico Sept. 4, when he had a Pac-10 best 225 all-purpose yards, including 147 rushing and 60 receiving. Harris tied a conference record by scoring two touchdowns on punt returns and was second to Barner with 125 all-purpose yards against the Lobos. The weekly honor was a first for Harris and the second for Barner, who earned special teams' accolades following his performance at UCLA in 2009 (Week 6). They became the first Oregon duo to win weekly Pac-10 honors since **Jeremiah Masoli** (offense) and SR QB **Nate Costa** (special teams) did so in Week 12 last season after an overtime win at Arizona.

The College Football Performance Awards also honored the pair, selecting Harris as the national punt returner of the week and tabbing Barner as honorable mention running back of the week.

JOIN THE CLUB

SR RB **Remene Alston Jr.** and SO RB **Kenjon Barner** etched their names in the UO record book by each surpassing 100 yards rushing for the first time in the win vs. New Mexico Sept. 4. Alston set career highs with 21 carries and 110 yards, as did Barner, who rushed 17 times for a net of 147. Teammate SO RB **LaMichael James** has nine such efforts in his career.

TOP 25

The Ducks moved up from No. 11 in both polls to No. 7 in the Associated Press top 25 and No. 8 in the USA Today (coaches poll) top 25 after Week 1. UO was ranked as high as seventh by the AP three times last season and once by the coaches.

CLEAN SHEET

The 72-0 result vs. New Mexico Sept. 4 was the Ducks' first shutout since blanking Stanford 35-0 on Oct. 25, 2003.

THE GANG'S ALL HERE

Oregon's 2010 defense was billed as a swarming, deep crew during preseason camp and that description looks to be spot-on if the season opener was any indication. The Ducks, who forced five turnovers, saw 29 players make a tackle with 20 of those guys recording multiple stops.

SAME AS IT EVER WAS

It had been nearly two years since SO QB **Darron Thomas** had played in a game at Autzen Stadium, but his second appearance was almost identical to his first, statistically speaking (the outcomes were obviously different). The Texan's home debut came vs. Boise State on Sept. 20, 2008, when he was taken out of a potential redshirt with just over 15 minutes to play and nearly led the Ducks back from a 24-point deficit. In that game, he completed 13 of 25 passes for 210 yards, 3 TDs and had 1 INT. In his second home game (vs. NM, Sept. 4, 2010), this time playing just over one quarter at the beginning of the contest, UO's newly minted starter completed 13 of 23 passes for 220 yards, 2 TDs and 1 INT. So in barely more than a half of home football (35:55 to be precise), Thomas is 26 of 48 (54.2%) for 430 yards, 5 TDs and 2 INTs.

ARE YOU EXPERIENCED?

At the start of last season, UO had 18 returning players with starting experience. This year, 27 such student-athletes came in with at least one starting assignment under their belts. Last year's returners totaled 174 career starts while this year's returners total 279, an average of 12.7 per man on the 2-deep depth chart.

CAN I GET AN ENCORE

After claiming its third Pacific-10 Conference championship of the decade ('00, '01 and '09), Oregon sets its sights on its ninth league title

in 2010. (Only USC won more shares of the conference crown, 7, during that span than Oregon.) The Ducks hope their next 10 seasons will be as successful, if not more, than the previous decade as they accumulated more wins (87-38, 69.6%) than any other 10-year span in school history. Entering 2000 having achieved a school-record nine wins on six occasions, Oregon not only matched that number since the start of the century, it posted 10 or more victories in a single season five times.

RUNNING FOR THE RECORD

Running back **LaMichael James** enters his sophomore season with nine career 100-yard rushing efforts to his credit (equalling a single-season school record with **Jonathan Stewart** {2007} and **Saladin McCullough** {1997}). That mark places him in a three-way tie for ninth on Oregon's all-time list for most 100-yard games, and only five away from Stewart's (2005-07) UO record of 14. James eclipsed the 100-yard pinnacle in eight of nine Pac-10 games a year ago, including seven straight to end the regular season.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Only three new starters took the field in Oregon's season opener vs. New Mexico, led by SO QB **Darron Thomas** as the only first-time starter for the offense. On defense, JR DE **Terrell Turner** and SR DT **Zac Clark** made opening assignments for the first time. True FR K **Eric Solis** handled kicking duties in his first-ever game at Autzen.

2010 PAC-10 PRESEASON POLL

The University of Oregon received the top spot in the Pac-10 preseason media poll. The defending Pac-10 champions garnered 15 first-place from the 35 West Coast media members who participated in the poll. The Ducks earned the top spot for just the second time since the poll began in 1961. Oregon was also a preseason favorite in 2001, going on to win the Pac-10. The media poll has correctly selected the Conference Champion in 26 of 49 previous polls, including nine of the last 10.

Other confirmed TV games - at Arizona State (Sept. 25, FSN), Stanford (Oct. 2, ESPN), UCLA (Oct. 21, ESPN), USC (Oct. 30, ABC), and Arizona (Nov. 26, ESPN). The Oregon at Oregon State game (Dec. 4) is guaranteed to be televised - the remaining questions are what time and network. The choices would be 12:30 (ABC), 4:00 (Versus) or 7:30 (FSN). In addition, home games vs. New Mexico (Sept. 4, 12:30 p.m.) and Portland State (Sept. 18, 3:15 p.m.) will be televised by the Oregon Sports Network via Comcast SportsNet Northwest.

KELLY AT AUTZEN

Head coach **Chip Kelly** made his sideline debut at Autzen Stadium Sept. 12, 2009 (W 38-36 vs. Purdue) after spending the prior two seasons calling plays from a booth high above the field as the team's offensive coordinator. Since Kelly's arrival in 2007, the Ducks are 18-3 at Autzen, averaging 42.6 points per home game.

AUTZEN ADVANTAGE

The Ducks have won 11 straight games at Autzen Stadium, dating to 2008, which is the second longest streak in stadium history. UO won a record 23 straight between 1997 and 2001. Oregon has won its last nine Pac-10 contests at home since falling in overtime against Oregon State in the 2007 Civil War.

HOUSE OF LOUD

With an opening day record crowd of 59,106 vs. New Mexico on Sept. 4, Oregon has sold out Autzen Stadium (cap. 54,000) for 69 consecutive games, dating to 1999.

COACHING CONTINUITY

An overlooked facet of Oregon's success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. Although second-year head coach **Chip Kelly** begins just his fourth season as part of the Ducks' program, the core of the staff has remained intact over the course of three different head coaches. Running backs coach **Gary Campbell** enters his 28th year on the Oregon staff, which equals the longest tenure of any Oregon assistant football coach in school history. In addition, offensive line coach and running game coordinator **Steve Greatwood** begins his 25th year on the Ducks' coaching staff, linebackers coach **Don Pellum** is in his 23rd season, while defensive coordinator **Nick Aliotti** begins his 20th season at Oregon.

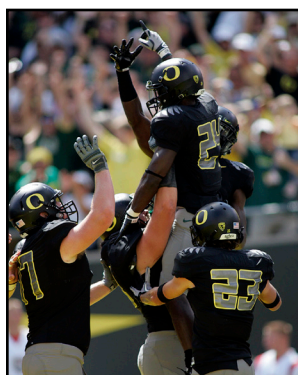

EUGENE, Ore. (AP)—The Ducks didn't need LaMichael James against New Mexico, and they certainly didn't miss Jeremiah Masoli.

Kenjon Barner and Darron Thomas seamlessly filled the roles of running back and quarterback for No. 11 Oregon in its 72-0

blowout of New Mexico on Saturday.

With James suspended for a game, Barner scored five touchdowns, four on the ground and another via a pass from Thomas. He ran for a career-high 147 yards as Oregon racked up a school-record 720 yards in total offense.

Thomas completed 13 of 23 passes for 220 yards and two scores in his debut as starter after the dismissal of Masoli in the offseason.

If the Ducks were trying to put their troubled recent past behind them, it worked.

"I guess it says a lot," Barner said. "Numbers don't lie."

Oregon's point total tied the Autzen Stadium record the Ducks set in 1999 against Nevada. The most points Oregon has ever scored is 115, against Puget Sound back in 1910.

New Mexico was also looking for a fresh start. The Lobos were 1-11 last season under coach Mike Locksley, who had an altercation with a former assistant and was named in a sexual harassment complaint.

But the Lobos, who managed just 107 total yards on offense, were no match for last year's Pac-10 champions. B.R. Holbrook made his debut as New Mexico's starter, and completed just 11 of 24 passes for 70 yards with two interceptions.

"We're disappointed. I feel like our team has a different mentality from last season, but we didn't execute today," Holbrook said. "Oregon is the reigning Pac-10 champ, so you have to give them credit. But you never think things will go that badly."

Barner subbed for James because the running back was suspended for a game after pleading guilty to a misdemeanor harassment charge that stemmed from a conflict with an ex-girlfriend.

Last season James grabbed national attention by rushing for a team-high 1,546 yards, setting a new record for freshmen in the Pac-10. He averaged 6.7 yards and added 14 TDs to earn the league's freshman of the year honors.

James watched from the sideline Saturday wearing an "O" T-shirt and khaki shorts. He will return to the Ducks next weekend when they visit Tennessee.

Also a return specialist, Barner had 1,553 all-purpose yards last season. He had 225 against New Mexico, and his one catch was a 60-yard catch and run from Thomas in the second quarter.

"I've been saying all along, I think he's the most underrated player in the country," Oregon coach Chip Kelly said. "Today he got a chance to shine. We've always felt that we've had 1A and 1B. We run the ball 40 times a game; one guy is not going to get all the carries."

Standing in for Barner on the return team was Cliff Harris, who returned two punts for touchdowns, an Oregon record for one game.

Masoli had been expected to lead the Ducks at QB this season, but he was accused in a fraternity house theft in January and wound up pleading guilty to a burglary charge. Kelly finally kicked him off the team when he was stopped by police for a traffic violation and marijuana was found in the car.

Masoli has since gone to play at Mississippi, which was upset by Jacksonville 49-48 in double overtime Saturday.

Thomas played in five games as a true freshman in 2008, completing 16 of 33 passes for 268 yards and three touchdowns. Called upon when Oregon was hit by a slew of injuries, Thomas came close to leading the Ducks to a come-from-behind victory against Boise State that season before redshirting in 2009.

"I wasn't overconfident because I never knew what was going to happen," Thomas said. "I needed to come out today and have a good game. I took a couple of hits but that's what I wanted to do to get me back into a rhythm."

The Lobos had a setback in the first half when defensive lineman Carmen Messina, who led the nation with 162 tackles last season, got hit hard and injured his left ankle. He did not return.

New Mexico said details about the injury were not known. Messina planned to return to New Mexico for an MRI on Sunday.

New Mexico is now 7-44 against ranked opponents. The last time the Lobos played a Pac-10 opponent, they beat Arizona 36-28 in 2008.

It was the Lobos' biggest margin of defeat since losing 94-17 to Fresno State in 1991. The last time the Lobos were shutout was in 2007, when they lost 37-0 to TCU.
